



Session 5 Summary: Your Regional Assets and Challenges

The rubber really did hit the road when <u>Stronger Economies Together (SET)</u> brought **52 participants** from throughout the tri-county region to Chewelah on July 19, 2012.

Krisan LeHew, Chewelah City Council, and Mary Verner, Spokane Tribal Enterprises, welcomed everyone and Debra Hansen, WSU Extension, kicked off a day focused on regional assets and economic development.

Lorie Higgins, University of Idaho Extension, presented an excellent overview of assetbased economic development. She provided many resources and included successful examples from Washington, Idaho, and Appalachia.
